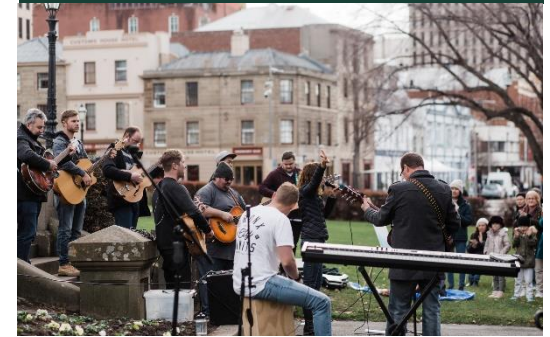

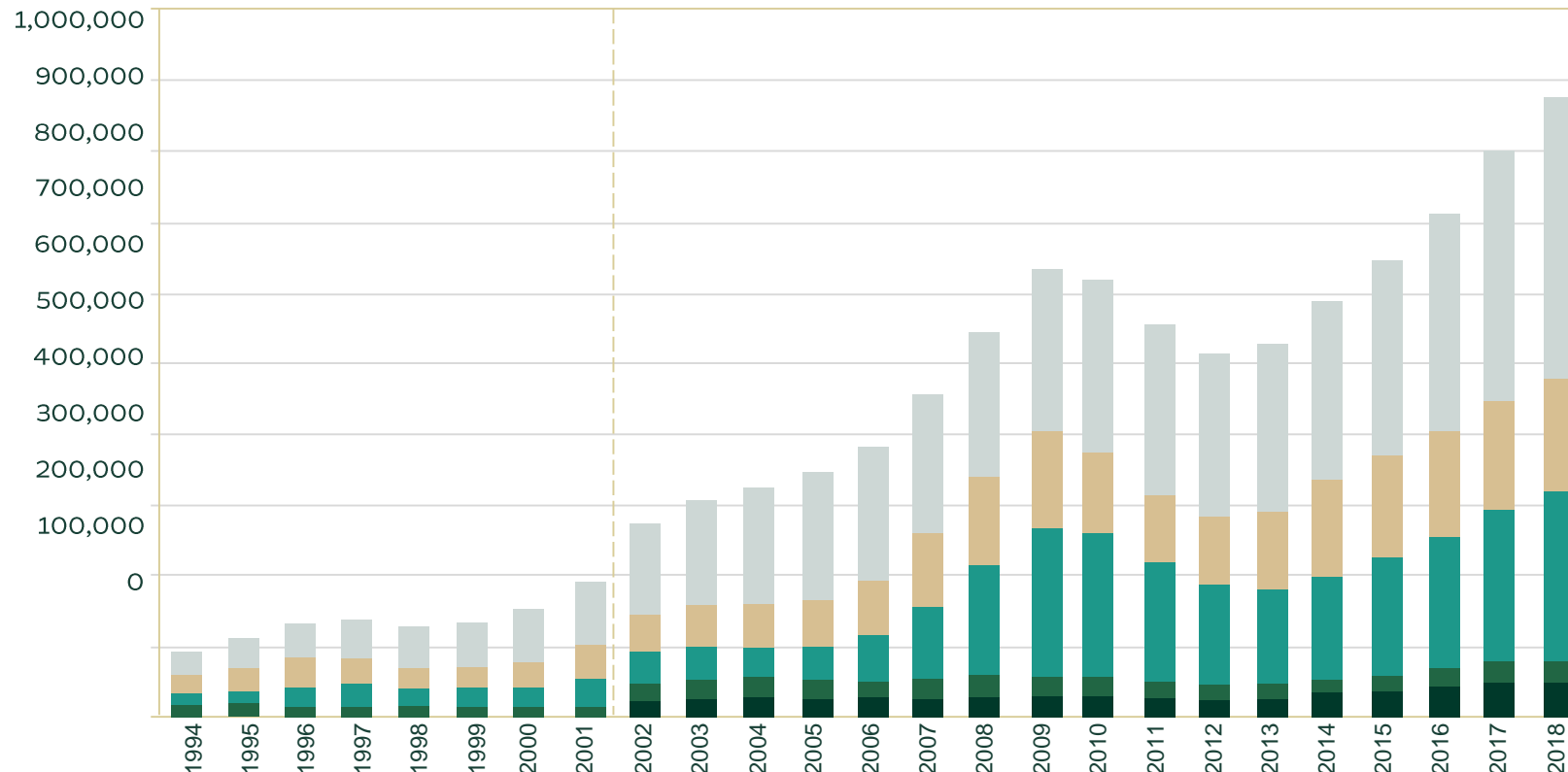

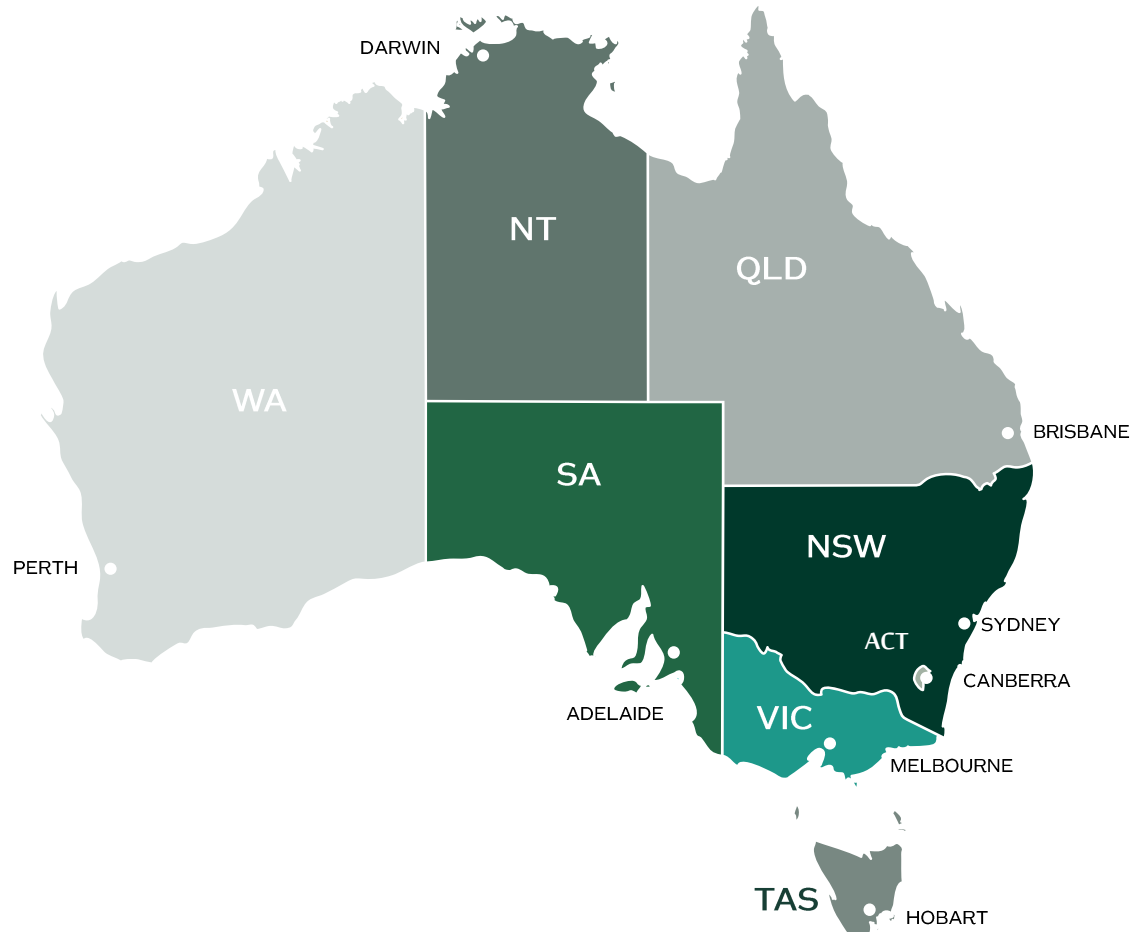

Destination Australia scholarship program

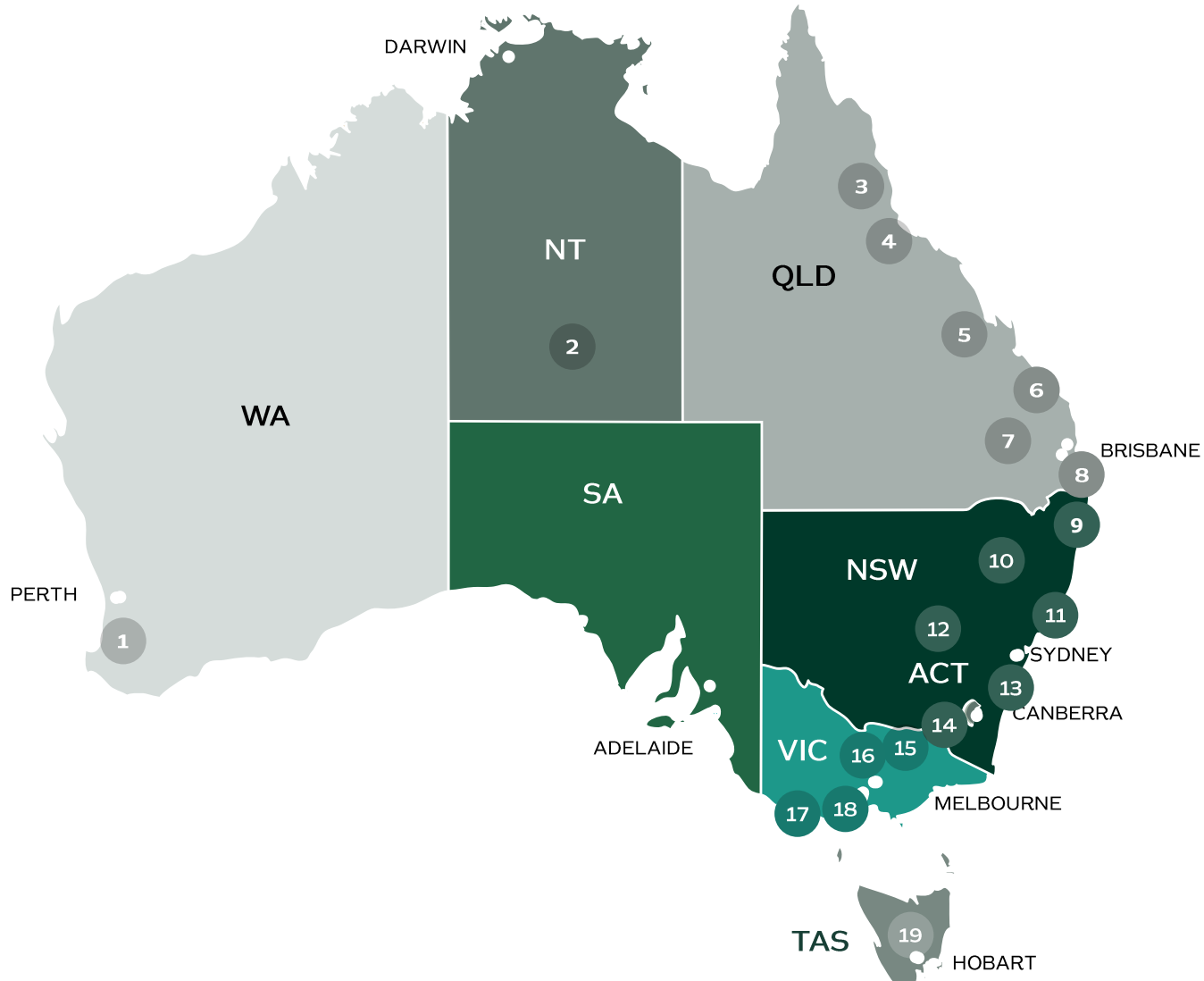
The Australian government has announced the Destination Australia scholarship program to support students to study in regional Australia.
